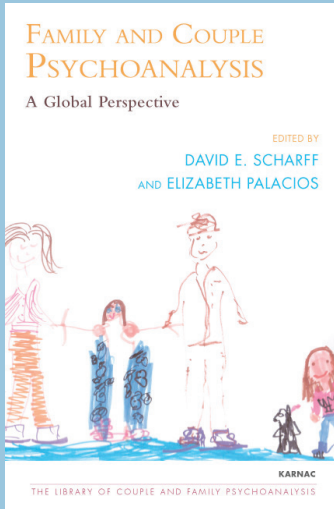

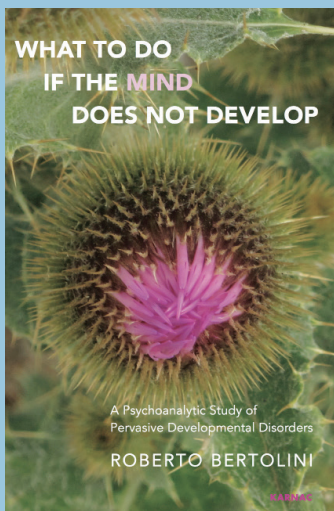

These books are a useful aid for any clinician or psychoanalytic scholar, and for anyone interested in the thinking of one of the great analysts of the twentieth century.

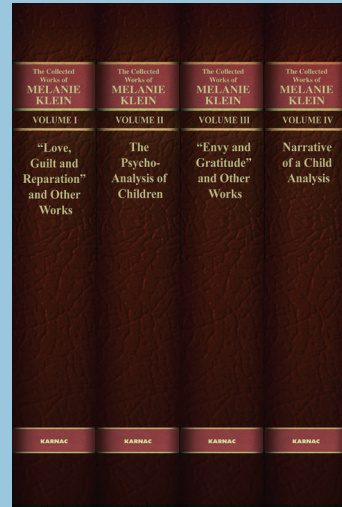

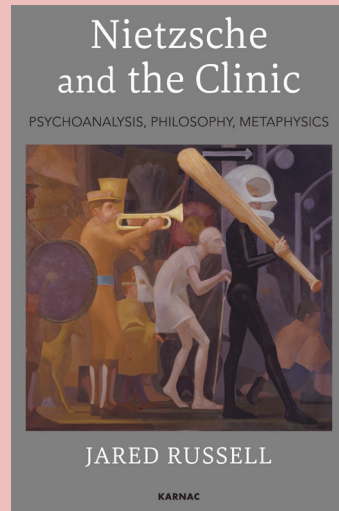
Carved by Experience

Vipassana, Psychoanalysis, and the Mind Investigating Itself

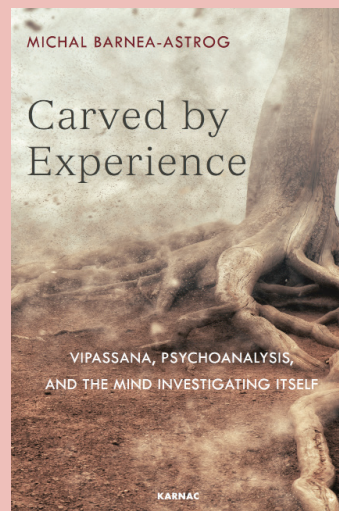

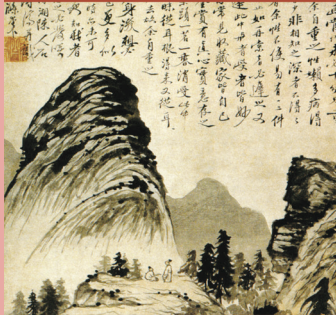

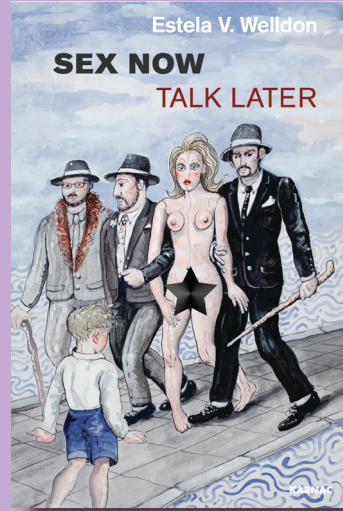

How to Understand Your Therapist and Other Erotica

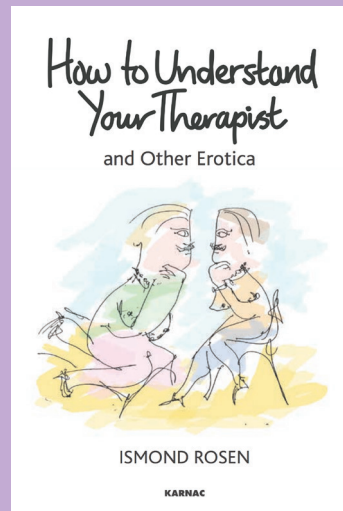

As a respected psychoanalyst and artist, Ismond Rosen saw many similarities between his two professions, and felt strongly that one fed into the other: The creative demands on the analyst and analysand, he suggested, were mirrored in the creative process of the visual artist. These wry and perceptive cartoons take a mischievous look at the world of psychotherapy, gently satirising it while making some salient points about the roles of the therapist and the patient.

Ismond Rosen (1924–1996) was a psychoanalyst and artist. He studied at the École des Beaux-Arts and the Académie Julian in Paris. He then came to London and worked at the Maudsley and the Portman Clinic, and trained in association with Anna Freud as a psychoanalyst. He did psychoanalytic research at the Hampstead Clinic and practised privately, almost to the end of his life, while continuing his prolific work as an artist.

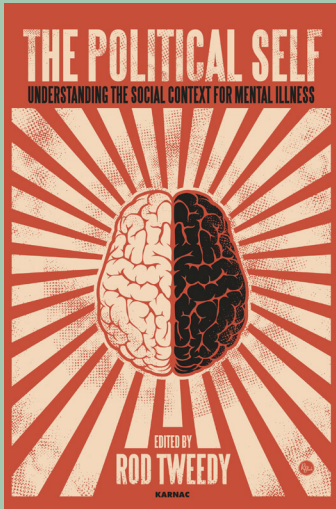

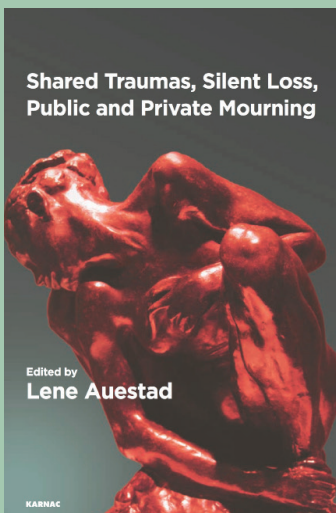

Rather than aiming to present a diagnosis of the political present, this volume instead takes one step back to pose the question of what mourning might mean and what its social dimension consists of. Contributors reflect on the trauma of the Holocaust, the after-effects of the Vietnam War in the US, the Lebanese war-torn experience, victims of the Pacific War in Taiwan, and the Chilean dictatorship.

Lene Auestad is Research Fellow in Philosophy at the University of Oslo, and affiliated with the Centre for Studies of the Holocaust and Religious Minorities, Oslo. She moved to the UK to pursue long-standing interests in British psychoanalysis.



Immigrants and Refugees

Trauma, Perennial Mourning, Prejudice, and Border Psychology

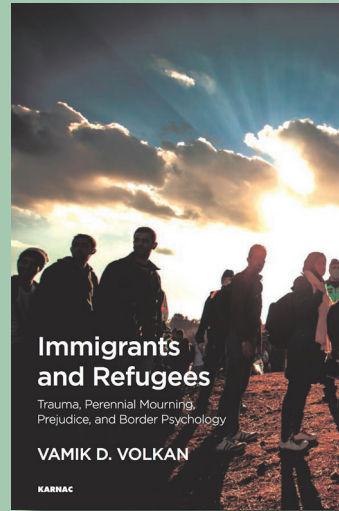

Aside from the many political, cultural and economic aspects of the present refugee crisis in Europe, it is also crucial to consider the psychological element. In our fast-changing world, globalisation, advances in communication technology, fast travel, terrorism, and now the refugee crisis make psychoanalytic investigation of the Other a major necessity.

Psychoanalyst Vamik Volkan, who left Cyprus for the US as a young man, brings his own experiences as an immigrant to bear on this study of the psychology of immigrants and refugees, and of those who cross paths with them.

In Part I, case examples illustrate the impact of traumatic experiences, group identity issues, and how traumas embedded in the experience of immigrants and refugees can be passed down from one generation to the next. Part II focuses on the host countries, considering the evolution of prejudice and how fear of newcomers can affect everything from international politics to the way we behave as individuals. Volkan also considers the psychology of borders, from the Berlin Wall to Donald Trump. He argues that it is not enough to sympathise with the material plight of people who have left their homes; we must also strive to understand the mental health issues caused by their uprooting.

Vamik D. Volkan is an Emeritus Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Virginia, an Emeritus Training and Supervising Analyst at the Washington Psychoanalytic Institute, and the Senior Erik Erikson Scholar at the Austen Riggs Center in Massachusetts. He is president of the International Dialogue Initiative and a former president of the International Society of Political Psychology, the Virginia Psychoanalytic Society, and the American College of Psychoanalysts. In 2015 he received the Sigourney Award, honouring achievements for the advancement of psychoanalysis.

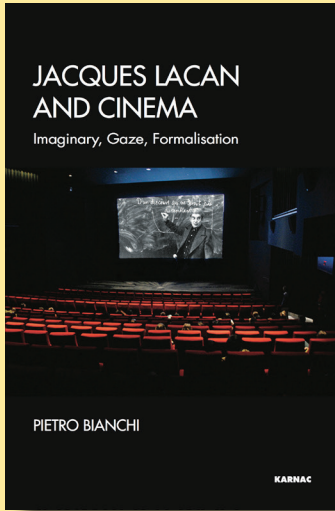

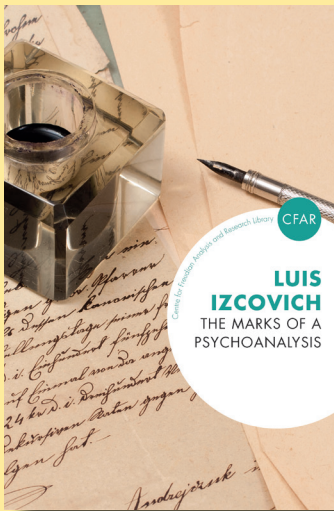

Jacques Lacan and Cinema Imaginary, Gaze, Formalisation

By **Pietro Bianchi**

Psychoanalysis has always been based on the eclipse of the visual and on the primacy of speech. However, the work of Jacques Lacan is strangely full of references to the visual field, from the intervention on the mirror stage in the 1940s to the elaboration of the object-gaze in the 1960s. In an exhaustive overview of the whole Lacanian theorisation of the visual, counterpointed by a confrontation with several thinkers of cinema, Pietro Bianchi leads the reader towards the discovery of the most counter-intuitive approaches of Lacanian psychoanalysis to the topic of vision.

Pietro Bianchi works at the Department of Romance Studies at Duke University, North Carolina. He was Research Fellow at the Jan Van Eyck Academy in Maastricht (2009–2010), and has published articles on literary theory, Lacanian psychoanalysis, and film studies.

Is someone radically different after an analysis? Since Freud, psychoanalysis has been questioned about what the psychoanalytic experience can change in someone's life beyond shedding light on symptoms. Drawing on literature, philosophy, and a range of psychoanalytic theorists and practitioners, Luis Izcovich addresses the effects of psychoanalysis on the individual who has the desire and the courage to enter an analytic treatment and take it to its endpoint.

Luis Izcovich is a psychoanalyst, training psychiatrist, Doctor of Psychoanalysis (Paris VIII), and member of the International Forums of the Lacanian Field and of its School of Psychoanalysis, the SPFLF, of which he is one of its founding members.



Twenty-First Century Psychoanalysis

If psychoanalysis will survive in the twenty-first century, this book's wager is that it will be Lacanian psychoanalysis. Today, the survival of psychoanalysis is in question. Even Jacques Lacan himself, at the peak of his influence when psychoanalysis was a dominant discourse, did not believe that psychoanalysis would triumph. This book articulates a possible future for Lacan and psychoanalysis, through an exploration of the historical trajectory of psychoanalysis and a survey of the ways Lacanian psychoanalysis offers a unique response to the pressing clinical demands of our time.

Thomas Svolos is a psychoanalyst and psychiatrist, and a Member of the New Lacanian School and the World Association of Psychoanalysis. He practices in Omaha, Nebraska, where he also serves as Professor and Chair of Psychiatry at the Creighton University School of Medicine.

Gurmeet S. Kanwal is clinical associate professor of psychiatry at the Weill Medical College of Cornell University, New York.

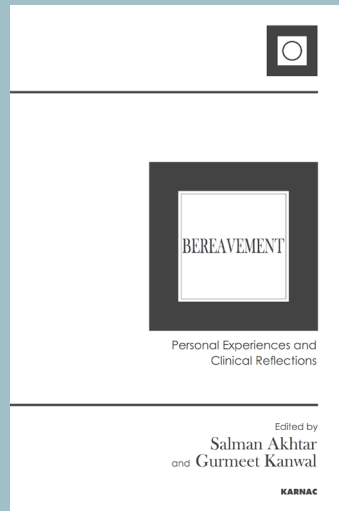
Sexual Difference in Debate

- Those who have been silenced about their experiences and survival strategies need to have their reality acknowledged and not pathologised.

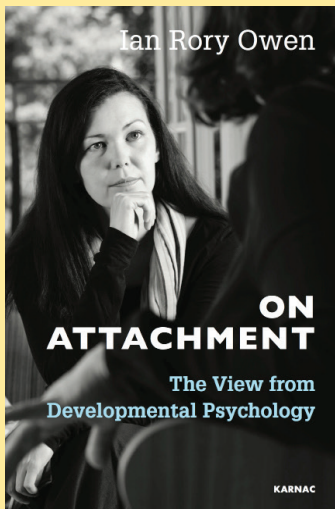
